

Example of Innovation Support Delivery

Departments Partnership (KTP) Transfer

- R&D on an idea/concept and transfer of R&D findings from University to Industry
- 40-60 % funding share between Govt. and an SME for the entire program; and hiring of a KTP associate for 18-36 months to work on the project
- Expected Key High-level activities of Innovation Support Delivery Departments
 - Identification of specialized segment in an industry to focus and provide business/technology support for growth








Example of Outcome/Benefits from KEN setup

- Role of Academic Institutes in Manipur (MU, CAU, IBSD, etc.)
 - · MIMS (of MU):
 - Design of a 5-day intensive 'Entrepreneurship Culturing and Enterprise Development' module followed by 4-8 weeks practical project implementation
 - Support for project/grant application and business setup by SMEs / graduates / locals to government departments and financial funders
 - Access to every village/towns for development by GoM wherein there is a nearby college or higher secondary school throughout Manipur
 - Feasibility to fund mini-projects/grants by various related departments in GoM to graduates/locals, and mentoring support by Experts from Overseas Manipuris
